BROADWAY'S BEST-LOVED MUSICAL *THE COLOR PURPLE* WILL PLAY UMASS FINE ARTS CENTER JANUARY 31 AND FEBRUARY 1

11/22/11 – The UMass Fine Arts Center is proud to announce that **THE COLOR PURPLE**, will play at the Fine Arts Center Concert Hall, January 31st and February 1st for two performances only. Tickets are on sale now.

This production of *The Color Purple*, produced by Phoenix Entertainment ~ Joyful Noisemakers LLC, helmed by Stephen Kane and Michael McFadden, is the next phase in the life of the ground-breaking Broadway hit musical produced by Scott Sanders. The original Broadway musical was nominated for eleven Tony Awards[®], including Best Musical, and the score was nominated for a GRAMMY[®]. Based on the classic Pulitzer Prize-winning novel by Alice Walker and the moving film by Steven Spielberg, The *Color Purple* is about hope and the healing power of love.

"The Color Purple" hit the Great White Way in 2005. It was a gutsy move to transform Walker's novel into a musical. But Pulitzer Prize-winner Marsha Norman wrote the book for the play, and a trio of Grammy Award®-winning pop-music writers, Brenda Russell, Allee Willis and

Stephen Bray, infused the music with blues, jazz, gospel and lots of soul. It played on Broadway for a little more than two years followed by a three year First National Tour. This Amherst appearance is the only one of three in New England, the other two being in New Haven, Ct and Orono, Maine.

The Color Purple tells the story of Celie, who by her early teens has already had two children by the man she knows as her father. He sends them away, inferring they are dead. She is given to a man who marries her, beats her and treats her like scum. He also hides the unread letters sent to Celie from her beloved sister, thus denying her that love and relationship. It paints a bleak picture of Celie's life. But it's also the story of triumph as she gathers the strength to become her own person and leave the men who abuse her.

Michael Kuchwara of the Associated Press described *The Color Purple* as "a Roof-Raising story of triumph." And Richard Corliss of *TIME* Magazine said, "[it is] a soaring, epic tale. It made a joyful noise in my heart." Elysa Gardner from USA Today raved, "Pure heart! It celebrates the inspiring relationships of faith and love, A Broadway hit!"

The Color Purple is directed by Gary Griffin with choreography by Donald Byrd.

Rounding out the creative team are Tony Award®-winner John Lee Beatty (sets), Paul Tazewell (costumes), Tony Award®-winner Brian MacDevitt (lighting), Craig Cassidy (sound design),

Steven M. Bishop (Orchestrations/Arrangements), and Jasper Grant (Music Director).

Tickets for The Color Purple are \$45, \$35, and \$20; Five College, GCC, STCC students and youth 17 and under are \$20.
