# CREOLE CHOIR OF CUBA BRINGS CARIBBEAN RHYTHMS AND MELODIES TO THE UMASS FINE ARTS CENTER

On Wednesday, October 12 at 7:30 P.M., the UMass Fine Arts Center hosts the <u>Creole Choir of Cuba</u> in a Concert Hall performance that will feature impassioned singing and rhythmic dancing by this unique group. Soaring a capella arrangements of Haitian and Martinique merengues, mazurkas, and other styles—sung in Creole and strengthened by tight Afro-Caribbean percussion—come together in a stirring live performance. A preperformance "Fireside Chat" at the UMass University Club by Grete Viddal of Harvard University's Department of African and African-American Studies begins at 6:30 P.M. (Park in Lot 62 for easy access to the Club and the Concert Hall.) A cultural celebration of the Creole music from the Oriente de Cuba will be held in the Concert Hall lobby, also beginning at 6:30 P.M.

The Creole Choir of Cuba was founded in 1994 by Emilia Diaz Chavez, who is the choir's Director, and several current members of the troupe. The Choir's main objective is to promote Caribbean musical compositions, principally Haitian. They sing in Creole but also count Cuban musical traditions as part of their identity. The choir members themselves are part of the Haitian community in Camagüey and all are professional,

classically trained singers and musicians. They are part of the provincial choir of Camagüey, which has been formed for over 30 years.

Haiti and Cuban history intertwine at many points, beginning in the 18th century when Haitians were taken by French colonists as slaves to Cuba. More migrations to Cuba followed, this time in order to escape oppressive dictatorial regimes at home. Settling in Cuba, the descendants of those immigrants have sought to keep their traditions alive through story-telling, music, and dance.

As professional singers who are actively involved in the Haitian community, the members of the Choir worked hard to find out as much as they could about their ancestral homeland and its musical and cultural traditions. It was very important to them to keep the essence of Haiti in their music while retaining the Cuban element of their identities.

Tickets for the Creole Choir of Cuba are \$30, \$25, and \$15; Five College, GCC, STCC students and youth 17 and under are \$10.
