WAR VETERANS: A COMMEMORATION THROUGH ART, THEATER, LITERATURE, AND FILM

The War Veterans Commemoration includes a series of events on the University of Massachusetts Amherst campus to honor and commemorate veterans for serving our country. These events presented by the UMass Fine Arts Center are in collaboration with the Springfield Vet Center, Veterans Education Project of Amherst, UMass Veteran Services, UMass Student Union Art Gallery, and On The Same Page Northampton.

In addition to saluting the veterans who served during WWII, the Korean War, Viet Nam, and Gulf War, this project will enlighten the community about the issues facing soldiers returning home from Iraq and Afghanistan and how creative outlets help the healing process. Our troops are finding many challenges as they try to adapt back into civilian society. We hope that these events on the UMass campus will help educate the campus community and the general public on the needs of Veterans and their families. Other art institutions around the country are also aware of the need to reach out to veterans and to create outlets to support them. Art is powerful, and through art Veterans can start their healing process. All events are free except for the theater production of *The Things They Carried*.

The commemoration begins November 2nd with two visual art exhibit openings and a play based on Tim O'Brien's novel *The Things they Carried* which was also part of Northampton's Big Read this fall. **Creative Expressions An Art Exhibit by War Veterans** runs October 31 – November 19 with an opening reception on **November 2**, **5-7pm** at the UMass Student Union Art Gallery. The exhibit will feature paintings, photographs, drawings, sculptures, poems, and video by veteran artists from Massachusetts, Connecticut, and California. Artists include Ron Angelo, Harry Azmitia, Jr., Leonard Baskin, Ben Brody, Derek A. Berman, Russel B. At the same time Memorial Hall on the UMass Campus will open its doors for the exhibit I Was There Stories of War and Homecoming running November 2–18, Opening: November 2, 4–5pm, featuring a collection of photographic portraits of Veterans by David Turner paired with stories that explore themes of Tim O'Brien's book. The exhibit is co-sponsored by the Hallmark Institute of Photography. Memorial Hall is open M–F, 8am to 5pm.

That evening at 7:30pm in Bowker Auditorium the Asian Arts & Culture program will present **The Things They Carried** by **Tim O'Brien**, an American Place Theatre Literature to Life® Stage presentation. This production is the acclaimed one-person performance derived from Tim O'Brien's masterful best-selling novel, based on the author's experience as an Army infantryman serving in the Vietnam War. Later in the month on November 17th a panel discussion will take place about **Art** and the War Experience at 5pm in the Campus Center Cape Cod Lounge. The panel features artists and writers whose work have been motivated and informed by military and wartime experience, and explores the experience of war and homecoming. Participants include **Doug Anderson**, author of the award-winning collection of poetry about the Vietnam War, *The Moon Reflected Fire* and a memoir of service as a medical

corpsman with USMC infantry. **Matt Mitchell**, an artist who is painting portraits of Iraq and Afghanistan veterans for his national *100 Faces of War Experience* project. **Tyler Boudreau**, a former USMC infantry officer, Iraq veteran, UMass graduate student, and author of a wartime memoir, *Packing Inferno*, and a novel in progress. The panel is free and open to the public.

Interspersed among all these activities will be a series of **War on Film**, featuring war-related movies ranging from drama to documentary and comedy, November 5, 9, & 15 in the Campus Center Cape Cod Lounge, free and open to the public. The film series includes:
